Apply by September 30 to Recertify by CERPs

Beginning this year, IBCLCs are no longer required to take the exam every 10 years, but can recertify by CERPs instead. If you are planning to recertify by CERPs in 2022, you must complete your recertification requirements and apply by September 30 using IBLCE's new self-assessment tool to identify your competencies and guide the CERPs you must obtain.
